Church Celebrates Anniversary

The First Congregational Church, 24 Main Street, will celebrate its 235th Anniversary Sunday, November 17, during a special church service at 10 a.m. The service will include ringing the church's 148-year-old bell, reading from the church's history book (authored by Larry C. Berkson), special music and refreshments.

From the church's bylaws: "In the month of September, 1787 the Congregational Society met at the corn barn of Colonel John Cram, who was the first settler in the town. Here they deliberated, discussed, and planned for the spiritual welfare of the people, present and future, and here they took measures for the regular preaching of the gospel. On November 17, 1789, the Congregational Church of Pittsfield was duly organized, with the Congregational form of government, doctrine and discipline."



Cook's Corner Chicken Pot Pie Soup Slow Cooker

You are going to love this soup! It's good old-fashioned comfort food at its

finest. There are several ways to enjoy this. I usually serve it in baked puff pastry shells; however, you can also transfer the soup to a glass baking dish and top it with homemade or frozen pie crust; or you can pour the soup into individual ramekins and top each one with homemade or refrigerated biscuits and pop in the oven until the biscuits are done. This soup freezes well too. Bon appetit! *MP Christakos* ½ cup flour, divided

2 tsp poultry seasoning

½ tsp salt

½ tsp black pepper

3 lbs boneless, skinless chicken thighs, cut into 1 inch pieces

2 TBSP vegetable oil

2 (14.5 oz) cans chicken broth

1 cup sliced carrots, sliced on the diagonal

1 cup sliced celery

1 cup chopped yellow onion

2 TBSP fresh thyme leaves, or 1 tsp dried, crushed

1 cup frozen peas

1 cup Half & Half

In a large resealable plastic bag combine ¼ cup of the flour, the poultry seasoning and the salt and pepper. Add the chicken pieces, half at a time, shaking to coat. In a large skillet, heat 1 TBSP of the oil over medium high heat. Add half of the chicken; cook 4 minutes or until browned, stirring occasionally. Transfer the chicken to the slow cooker bowl. Repeat with remaining 1 TBSP oil and cook the rest of the chicken. Add the broth, carrots, celery, onion and thyme leaves to the chicken in the slow cooker. Cover and cook on LOW for 6 or 7 hours, or on HIGH for 3 to 3 & ½ hours.

If using low, switch to HIGH. Stir in frozen peas. In a small bowl combine remaining ¼ cup flour and the Half & Half and stir into the slow cooker. Cover and cook on HIGH for another 45 minutes or until the sauce has thickened.

Hometown Hero Helps Fight Fires Out West

When Eric Nilsson joined the Pittsfield Fire Department 8 years ago, one of the first training exercises he completed was the wild land module and he loved it.

In the 5 years since Eric has been full time with the fire department, he's made 5 trips. This summer he was in Oregon, fighting a 25,000 acre fire with an engine crew of 10 people. Last year he went to Nova Scotia to fight the enormous fire up there which was the largest in the history of that area. Eric has also assisted in Quebec, Minnesota and Montana. The trips typically last for 2 weeks, with fourteen to sixteen hour days, straight through. Eric shared that sometimes they are put up in hotels, but more often they bring all their own gear for tent camping.

The New Hampshire Forest Protection Service organizes these trips at the state level, and there is Federal funding as well. Eric continues to pursue training and recently obtained his "Faller 2" certification, which means he is experienced in cutting down certain types of trees to help contain fires. He said, "it's very exciting work. Yes, we're fighting dangerous fires, but these places are so beautiful; and I feel as though I'm making a difference. Plus I've
