PUBLIC HEARING MEETING NOTICE TOWN OF PITTSFIELD BOARD OF SELECTMEN

PUBLIC HEARING

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 2025

Notice is hereby given in accordance with NH RSA 40:14 that the Board of Selectmen will conduct a hearing to receive public comment to consider rescinding the provisions of RSA 40:13 official ballot referendum form of meeting (known as SB 2) to return to a Traditional Town Meeting format.

The Board of Selectmen has placed the following question on the 2025 annual town warrant:

Shall we rescind the provisions of RSA 40:13 (known as SB 2), as adopted by the Town of Pittsfield on March 13, 2018, so that the official ballot will no longer be used for voting on all questions, but only for the election of officers and certain other questions for which the official ballot is required by state law, and return to traditional town meeting format?

(3/5-majority ballot vote required)

The public hearing will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 11, 2025, at the Town Office, 85 Main Street, Pittsfield, NH 03263.



Cook's Corner

Mug Cakes – A "Three-fer"!

) Here are three super easy, sweet treats that are certain to delight your special

Valentine. You likely have most of these ingredients already, but if not, do yourself a favor and make sure your pantry is always stocked with what you'll need, as there is a very high probability that these mug cakes will be made on repeat. These are also a really fun activity for the kiddos to help with. Enjoy!

Brownie Mug Cake

3 TBSP flour

3 TBSP cocoa powder

2 TBSP sugar

2 TBSP vegetable oil

4 TBSP milk

2 TBSP chocolate chip morsels

Ice cream for serving, optional, but highly

recommended!

Combine all ingredients <u>except</u> chocolate chips, in a large microwave safe mug or small bowl and mix well until smooth. Stir in chocolate chips. Microwave on high for 1 to 1&1/2 minutes until cooked through, and when skewered it comes out clean.

Banana Mug Cake

- 1 banana, peeled
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 TBSP vegetable oil
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 TBSP maple syrup
- 4 TBSP flour
- 1/2 tsp baking powder

1 TBSP chopped pecans OR chocolate chip morsels

Cut 2 thin slices of banana from the center of the fruit, set aside. Mash the rest of the banana. Place mashed banana into a microwave safe mug or small bowl. Stir remaining ingredients, <u>except</u> the 2 banana slices. Microwave on high for 1 &1/2 to 2 minutes or until when skewered, it comes out clean. Cool for 1 minute. Top with remaining banana slices and <u>drizzle with more maple syrup if desired.</u>

Vanilla Mug Cake

2 TBSP butter
1½ tsp sugar
6 TBSP flour
½ tsp baking powder
3½ TBSP milk
½ tsp vanilla extract
4 tsp confectioner's sugar
Topping ideas: sprinkles, fresh berries, sliced banana

Put butter in a microwave safe mug or small bowl and microwave for 35 to 45 seconds until melted. Stir in sugar, flour, baking powder, milk and vanilla extract until smooth. Microwave on high for 1 to 1 minute & 15 seconds until cooked through, and when skewered it comes out clean. Set aside. Combine confectioner's sugar with enough water to create a drizzly consistency then spoon over the cake. Serve with your preferred toppings if desired.
