Selectboard Review - July 9

We discussed political signs being placed on town-owned property. NH law stipulates that signs have to be approved by the property owner adjacent to the road, and are not allowed on publicly owned land. Therefore, political advertising found on town-owned property will be removed and stored outside at the public works garage. If you have a sign missing, check with the highway department.

Certified Officer Michael Clark was rehired after an absence of several years by the police department. He's currently serving in Belmont.

A request for a waiver of a civil forfeiture for unlicensed dogs was denied. A junkyard license renewal was granted to Pittsfield Salvage. Other miscellaneous housekeeping items were dispatched. We reviewed the default budget under which we are operating and despite careful spending, find we must, in some cases, rob Peter to pay Paul. Continually rising prices put us further into a bind for funds. As seems usual, when we don't have money enough to operate an aspect of necessary town services, whatever they might be, the highway department takes the hit and money gets transferred out of their budget. Please keep that in mind when criticizing what we can afford to have them do on an already tight budget that gets reduced further to get us out of a numbers crunch. *Carl Anderson*

Cook's Corner Asian Chicken & Broccoli (Slow Cooker)

Many of us may think the slow cooker is used mostly in the colder months, but using your slow cooker in the summer is a great way to keep the kitchen cool on hot days. This recipe is super easy and will satisfy your craving for "Chinese Carryout." A nice salad of baby greens, thin sliced red onion and a few fresh orange slices, tossed in a light Asian-inspired dressing is a great side for this; but you could

also pan fry some pot stickers or heat up some prepared, frozen egg rolls. Enjoy, MP Christakos

Ingriedients:

½ cup chicken broth

1/3 cup soy sauce

3 TBSP packed brown sugar

2 TBSP rice vinegar

3 large cloves garlic, minced

1 TBSP ginger paste

1 TBSP toasted sesame oil

1/4 tsp crushed red pepper flakes (optional, but recommended)

1 & ½ lb boneless, skinless chicken thighs, cut into ½-inch strips

1 medium onion, thinly sliced vertically

3 TBSP cornstarch

3 TBSP water

5 cups fresh broccoli florets

1 (8 oz) box shiitake mushrooms, sliced in half (optional)


1 TBSP toasted sesame seeds, for garnish Hot rice or cauliflower rice for serving

Whisk together broth, soy, brown sugar, vinegar, garlic, ginger, sesame oil and crushed red pepper (if using) in your slow cooker bowl.

Add chicken and onion to the slow cooker, stir well to coat. Cover and cook on HIGH for 1 & ½ hours or on LOW for 3 hours.

Whisk together cornstarch and water in a small bowl. Stir into the chicken mixture. Add the shiitake mushrooms (if using) and stir. Add the broccoli florets to the top of the chicken mixture – BUT DO NOT STIR. If cooking on LOW, switch heat to HIGH. Cover and cook on HIGH for 25 minutes or until broccoli is crisp-tender.

Stir mixture before serving. Top each serving with toasted sesame seeds.



Selectboard Review - July 23

Patrol Officer Justin Bishop's resignation from the PD was accepted with regret. He's done a great job for us, but personal circumstances required that he make a change in employment. Police Chief Joe Collins and Sgt. Devon Rego reported 70 traffic stops since our last meeting two weeks ago. The department is dedicated to doing their best to curb speeding in town, but, like everywhere, they've got their work cut out for them. As a side note - most people think the town receives revenue from traffic tickets, however that isn't the case. We get zero revenue from the court. Chief Collins also expressed his concern about numerous, ongoing, false, defamatory accusations being voiced in some circles around town and their potential effect on his officer's reputations and futures. The Selectboard has every confidence in our police department and share the Chief's concern that relentless, baseless slander can have negative consequences for innocent employees; therefore, we will consult with the town's attorney about possible prosecution of the offender(s). Any resident who has any question or concern about the Police (or any) Department is doing not only themselves, but the whole town, a disservice by regurgitating 'water cooler' hearsay rather than stepping up to the Chief or the Board of Selectmen. It's easy enough to do and we will investigate any valid concern.

Deputy Fire Chief and EMD Rob Freese expressed his appreciation to Public Works Director Noel Gourley for immediately responding to Rob's request for traffic cones and barricades when the state failed to come through with these items for Old Home Day, despite having been dependable in the past. The road agent was in the middle of a highway project, but in the spirit of cooperation that permeates throughout all Pittsfield's departments, he saw to it that the needs of public safety were met.

Melissa Babcock was congratulated on her job as Chair of the Old Home Day Committee. Job well done! Jason Stone was hired as part-time Firefighter/EMT. Donna Keeley was appointed as volunteer for alternate Pittsfield citizen rep. on BCEP.

The Selectboard expressed unanimous support for the Health Officer's efforts to require cleanup of trash and garbage at the residence at the corner of Carroll and Main St.
